___ ***Women Owned Business:*** Small business that is at least 51% woman owned.

___ ***Veteran Owned Business:*** Small business that is at least 51% veteran owned.

___ ***Service Disabled Veteran Business:*** A small business that is at least 51% owned by one or more service disabled veterans.
