

AmerisourceBergen Agreement with CDC to Support Independent Community Pharmacies' Access to COVID-19 Vaccine

AmerisourceBergen recently reached an agreement to support independent pharmacy access in Phase 2 (pink highlighted section on the chart below). As we continue to garner additional information from the CDC will be providing updates to eligible independent retail pharmacies on planning, preparation and ultimately administering the vaccine.

One of the most comprehensive resources available for pharmacists at this time is the CDC's <u>COVID-19</u> <u>Vaccination Program Interim Playbook for COVID-19 Vaccination Program Jurisdiction Operations.</u>

Operation Warp Speed (OWS) Timeline and Phased Approach:



- Once available, allocation of the vaccine(s) via the 'COVID-19 Vaccination Program' will be
 executed in phases based on recommendations set forth by CDC's Advisory Committee on
 Immunization Practices (ACIP.)
- In Phase 1a, State Immunization Managers and Departments of Health, acting on ACIPs recommendations, will focus initial product allocations on healthcare providers and long-term care staff and patients.
- In Phase 1b State Immunization Managers and Departments of Health will include a broader network of vaccinators (pharmacies, doctors' offices, public health clinics, mobile clinics, FQHCs) focusing on administration to Americans deemed essential, those over 65, and at higher risk for the virus as supply constraints are alleviated.
- Phase 2 and access to the general public will coincide with sufficient supply of the vaccine(s) and the opening of the retail channel via the Federal Pharmacy Partnership*.



*This is the phase that AmerisourceBergen has reached an agreement with CDC to support Independent Community Pharmacies' access to COVID-19 vaccine

Operation Warp Speed:

The pandemic has created unprecedented public/private partnerships. Operation Warp Speed (OWS) is a collaboration of several US federal government departments including Health and Human Services and its subagencies, Agriculture, Energy and Veterans Affairs and the private sector. Within OWS, the US National Institutes of Health (NIH) has partnered with more than 18 biopharmaceutical companies to accelerate development of drug and vaccine candidates for COVID-19 (ACTIV).

The <u>COVID-19 Prevention Trials Network (COVPN)</u> has also been established, which combines clinical trial networks funded by the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID): the HIV Vaccine Trials Network (HVTN), HIV Prevention Trials Network (HPTN), Infectious Diseases Clinical Research Consortium (IDCRC), and the AIDS Clinical Trials Group.

This situation continues to change, and planning will progress as more information about any authorized or approved vaccines becomes available. A safe and effective COVID-19 vaccine is a critical component of the U.S. strategy to reduce COVID-19-related illnesses, hospitalizations, and deaths and to help society function as it did before COVID-19. The goal of the U.S. government is to have enough COVID-19 vaccine doses for all people in the United States who choose to be vaccinated.

 - The interim playbook serves as an interim playbook for state, territorial (including the US-affiliated Pacific Islands [USAPI] of American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Guam, the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Republic of Palau), tribal, and local public health programs and their partners on how to plan and operationalize a vaccination response to COVID-19 within their jurisdictions. The document's sections cover specific areas of COVID-19 vaccination program planning and implementation and provide key guidance documents and links to resources to assist those efforts.
